What the Study Shows – and Why

- Measures higher ed capacity of America's 50 largest metro areas: students, degrees, finances
- Offers comparative view of collective college and university resources available to metro areas
- A region can't leverage higher ed strengths to best advantage unless it recognizes what it has
- To encourage government, business and civic leaders nationally to work more closely with their local colleges and universities



About the Study

- Data from U.S. Department of Education; students are FTE, degrees are Bachelor's and higher
- Measures change from 1989 to 2005 (when data collected); trend analysis prior to '89 difficult, '05 most recent data when study begun
- 50 largest metro areas determined by Census population data in Metropolitan Statistical Areas (MSAs) and Metropolitan Divisions (MDs)
- Fourth edition of study conducted by ARCHE



Key National Findings

America's 50 largest metro areas account for:

- 50% of all students attending college in U.S. (FTE)
- 51% of all degrees awarded in nation (Bachelor's+)
- 54% of all spending by U.S. higher ed institutions
- 64% of all higher ed research spending





Another key finding:

By any measure, Atlanta is a national leader in higher education.

In the U.S., Atlanta Ranks...

- 7th in college students enrolled (176,171 FTEs)
- 3rd in African American students enrolled (47,548 FTEs)
- 7th in academic degrees awarded (35,802 Bachelor's and higher)
- 5th in university research (\$1.01 billion)

- 118% increase in African American students attending Atlanta-area colleges and universities
- Atlanta #1 in nation for increase in number of African Americans enrolled
- Atlanta ranks 3rd in African American students
